As a key player on Mecanoo's integrated design teams, Anne-Marie is responsible for public realm visions and design including landscaping, garden design, aesthetic control and complex urban plans. Anne-Marie played a crucial role in the redesign of the TU Delft campus, Mekelpark as well as the Campus public space design for Fontys University of Applied Sciences in Eindhoven and the masterplanning of NOMA district in Manchester, including designing Angel Square, Manchester Engineering Campus Development and Library of Birmingham.

As a Landscape Architect, she was responsible for the design process, communication with the client and aesthetic control during the implementation phase, the garden design of the two roof terraces of the Library of Birmingham, as well as the design of the outdoor amphitheatre and public square. Anne Marie is also responsible for the landscaping of the University of Cambridge Key Worker Housing, which complies with the Code for Sustainable Homes Level 5 and achieved the equivalent of LEED Platinum certification.
